### **COMMUNITY BEGINS HERE**

Each semester I begin this catalog with a personal message from me to you. And in each catalog, I highlight the countless benefits of community. From discipleship, to friendship, to accountability, to knowledge of the Bible, the treasures discovered in community are worth the hunt. Something new occurred to me as I was reading in the book of Exodus recently. For the first time it occurred to me that one of the greatest gains of a group is courage. Yes, courage.

As I read Exodus 4 and the account of God sending Moses to Pharaoh on behalf of the Hebrews, I found a timid, unsure leader in Moses. In verse 13, Moses was begging God to "Please, Lord, send someone else." In fear, Moses didn't want to step into the weight of responsibility God was calling him to. So, instead of giving Moses a breather, He gave him a brother. A literal and figurative brother. He gave him Aaron. A brother to stand alongside him, to speak for him, to confide in and provide counsel. In short, Aaron was someone who would be strong where Moses felt weak. He provided Moses with community when he felt isolated and incapable.

What I found most interesting as I thought through the rest of the story of the Exodus was that while Aaron was a critical component in the early stages of Moses' leadership, as Moses grows more comfortable with center stage, Aaron fades to the background. Aaron fulfilled a role in the season of life when Moses most needed him. Where Moses was one man standing before Pharaoh, Aaron made two. And two is always better than one when you've been given an audience with the most powerful ruler in the world asking for the impossible. Aaron gave Moses the courage to step into the impossible task of becoming a deliverer and leader of a nation. That is community.

Reflecting on my own spiritual development, I've found that God has provided me with "Aarons" every step of the way. In my teen years there was my best friend, Chris, running alongside me on a pursuit of Christ. He saw my blind spots, called out my sin and challenged me to be different from the world. In my 20's it was Jim who loved me enough to allow me to be flawed as a pastor, yet stay in my corner. In my 30's there was Justin who never quit on me even when I wanted to quit on myself. In my 40's it's Josh,

Brian, Eric, Phil, and Nate who meet with me weekly to speak into my life. What I now realize is that all of these men have given me courage.

Without their friendship, I would have never found the courage to live out my calling. Moses needed an "Aaron." I need "Aarons" and you need an "Aaron." I want to help you find it. And I believe the best place to begin your search for that man or woman is in a group. So, as you browse through this catalog, I'm praying God might lead you to a group that will provide you with an "Aaron" that gives you the courage to become who He made you to be!

At Crossroads, we have a thriving upstart Young Adult Ministry (YAM). Young men and women ages 18-35 are finding community, connection, purpose and ministry opportunities just for them. In a time when many churches have little to offer this demographic, because of Crossroads' commitment to them, these young adults are finding a place where they belong. Listen to Natalie's story.

"I'm a 30-year-old single mom of 2 kids. I moved to Ohio in March right before the pandemic hit. So, as if moving across country with two kids by myself wasn't hard enough, throw in a pandemic, churches going online and a lockdown as well. Needless to say, it was hard to meet new people. I bought my home in July of 2020 in Mansfield and lived less than 5 minutes from Crossroads. I had tried this church out when I would come visit from California and I loved it each time, so I was excited to start back into in-person services at a church I was familiar with.

I prayed that God would bring me connection to friend groups with similar interests and in a similar age to me. So, when I found out about the Young Adult Ministry at Crossroads, I was ecstatic! Little did I know how life changing it would be meeting and getting involved with this group of young adults. Not only have my friendships with some of them grown tremendously, but I feel like I'm right where God wants me. I've never felt so at peace with my life. I get to do fun events every month with this group and feel involved and known, which for me personally is HUGE. I also have seen God continue to grow me in ways I never could have imagined.

I think God knew our community needed a group like this to come alongside during these young adult years as we're all navigating different seasons of life. I am on the "older side" of the young adults but that has also come with its own blessings. I get to meet and get to know younger women and be able to mentor them and help them grow in their faith and learn from the trials and valleys God has put me through." ~Natalie Trunnell

### **TYPES OF GROUPS AT CROSSROADS**

#### THEOLOGICAL

Theological groups have to do with the formal aspects of any gathering, and that is studying the Word of God. Each time a theological group meets, the Bible is the foundation to address and answer life's questions. Many of these groups place high emphasis on Christian doctrines, books of the Bible or Bible character studies. While philosophy and psychology serve a legitimate purpose, Christians need to return to the very words of God - the Bible - as the ultimate source for life's questions. The Bible then must be foundational to what we believe and practice.

#### RELATIONAL

While still placing an emphasis on the study of scripture, relational groups also have a familial focus because the group typically meets regularly over multiple semesters. The group members become friends. But more significantly, they experience what it means to be a family. A biblical family is one in which ALL of life is shared, the ups and downs and the triumphs and defeats. A healthy relational group will be like a healthy family - everyone is accepted, loved, held to account, and supported, no matter the circumstances.


#### RESTORATIONAL

Restorational groups provide shepherding and godly counsel for group members. If a marriage is struggling, an individual is going through grief, a veteran is struggling with PTSD, or someone is fighting an addiction - these types of issues become the bond that attracts and ministers to the group. While drawing from biblical teachings and principles, these groups find their focus in helping those in the group pursue recovery, support and counsel through the storm they're in.

#### MISSIONAL

Missional groups pursue an understanding of God's work in our world and actively join Him in it, be that in workplaces, neighborhoods, communities or the world. The missional group sends people outside of the "living room" and "church" and encourages participants to get involved in such things as community service, evangelism and global outreach. They are outward focused as a group and foster that orientation as individuals as well.

Since its inception, the Crossroads City Center has been a beacon of hope for the underserved in Richland County. But what we've also discovered along the way is how the City Center has brought purpose and cultural understanding to our team members who sacrificially serve their guests. Listen to Kimberly's story.

"As members of Crossroads Church, my husband and I have watched and supported the growth of the City Center from its initial planning. Since we both had full time jobs, we were unable to be more involved in the day-to-day activities. As I was preparing to retire from the corporate world at the beginning of 2021, I started researching what I would do with my weekdays. It was natural for me to look at the City Center as one of my volunteering options. I also talked with the Richland Pregnancy Services. Either seemed like a perfect option. But God had plans for me to do both. I interviewed the second day after retirement at the Richland Pregnancy Services. The Director immediately ran a background check and asked me to assist at the City Center that Friday. As it turns out, RPS had begun offering sonograms and pregnancy tests at City Center. I assist the RN with whatever she needs and help keep the boutique stocked.

Since my husband was also volunteering at the City Center on Tuesdays, I started going in with him. You never know what you'll be doing there. You can be handing out food boxes to those in need, cooking a meal, assisting with Bible study, or just being a friend. I have made so many new friends there and I can see the gratitude of those coming for the services we provide. I cannot tell you how it feels to give someone a coat they need or food for their family. I have grown so much personally and learned to be more flexible and less judgmental. It's remarkable how many people from Crossroads have either excitedly or apprehensively said "yes" to the call to go on a short-term mission trip over the last two decades. Even more remarkable is that time after time God has matched those faith-filled decisions to go with blessings beyond measure. Sonya tells a story of her experience with missions through Crossroads:

"My first experience on a mission trip was as a teenager traveling with my church's youth group. I loved the comradery of traveling with a team and the joy of helping others.

In 2005 and 2007, I had the opportunity to take the first of many mission trips with Crossroads. I assisted as a chaperone/nurse for youth trips to Mexico. In 2008, I was a member of the first Crossroads team to travel to Thailand and Cambodia with Asia's Hope. I continued to be active with the Crossroads mission trips and welcomed the way God challenged me when I was willing to be used by Him.

My prayers through this time were that my husband Steve would be able to experience these trips with me. Steve was always supportive of my going but felt that missions wasn't something that interested him.

By this time I had been feeling God's urging to go deeper in my walk for the gospel. A bit apprehensively I shared with Steve that I felt God was calling me to be involved in Africa. God had also been doing a work in his heart, and when I shared about Africa. I was overjoyed to find that he was all in. We have now traveled three times to Uganda and continue to be amazed by the plans that God has for us.
